



Key Supporting information for the 2022 Growing Up in North Yorkshire Survey

Five questionnaires are available, free of charge, for all stated funded and academies in North Yorkshire schools

The majority of questionnaires will now be offered primarily as online versions. This will enable a swifter return of data to schools and for many schools is a preferred way of conducting the surveys. We appreciate this may require some planning to enable pupils to be able to access the technology so they can complete the questionnaires.

Arrangements and instructions to access the online survey will be sent directly to schools to the named email contact provided when signing up to participate in the survey. For secondary schools that request paper copies of the questionnaire and special schools these will be sent and collected by courier for delivery to the SHEU, Exeter.

Primary Schools are encourage to participate in both the Key Stage 1 and 2 questionnaire	
Key Stage 1 questionnaire (Year 2 and Y3 for schools with fewer than 30 Y2 pupils)	Online survey only
Key Stage 2 questionnaire (Y6 pupils and Y5/4 for schools with fewer than 30 Y6 pupils)	Online survey only
Secondary schools with a sixth form are encouraged to enable Yr8, 10 and 12 pupils to participate in the survey	
Secondary questionnaire (including PRS) (Y8 and Y10 and Y12 pupils)	Online survey and paper version available
Post 16 in schools and Sixth Form Colleges (Y12)	Online survey
Special schools are encouraged to enable all pupils who are able to access the questions to participate (some guidance is provided for some of the questions)	
SEND questionnaire (Special school only / PRS)	Paper version only

Very small primary schools will receive their own school report provided there is a minimum of 7 pupils (to protect pupil confidentiality). For the smallest primary schools Year 4/5 pupils may participate in the Key Stage 2 questionnaire, but will need support to access the questions (and staff may want to consider the appropriateness of some questions for year 4 pupils). We will continue to offer our smallest schools the opportunity to have a joint school report with a partner school, to enable our smallest schools to participate whilst securing the anonymity of pupils.

Outcomes and use of data

The outcomes will be a set of countywide data at key points in children and young people's development.

Schools and Commissioning Authorities receive summaries of the processed data. CYPS will receive data at county and locality level and reports from each school. The results from your school will only be shared within agreed data sharing protocols. Where comparative analysis is thought desirable schools will only be identified by a code, not by name. Schools will receive their school report, and of course schools are free to share their own data with colleagues, governors, pupils, parents/carers and the wider community including other local organisations who can offer support.

Arrangements to participate

If you wish your school to participate in the 2022 survey, we will need the following arrangements to be made:

- A member of staff to be nominated to manage and supervise the questionnaire
- **To allocate up to 70 minutes of lesson time, between 2nd May-27th May 2022 for pupils in your school to complete the questionnaire.** The session must include an introduction and time for questions and for all pupils to be reminded that the questionnaire is anonymous so if it raises any issues or concerns for them where to find support within school. Adequate time and supported exam conditions are essential. The questionnaire should not be sent home with pupils to complete it must be completed on the school site.
- The questionnaire can be completed any day of the week EXCEPT a Monday (some questions are about yesterday) and not during a week following a school holiday (some questions are about last week)
