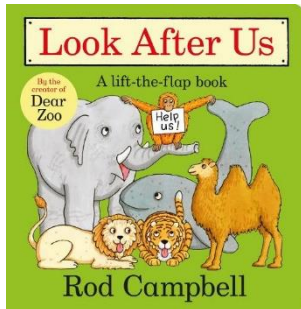


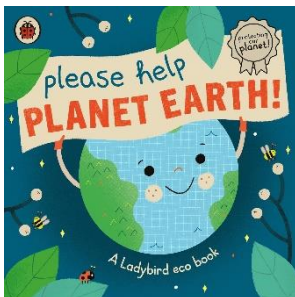

Look After Us: Rod Campbell

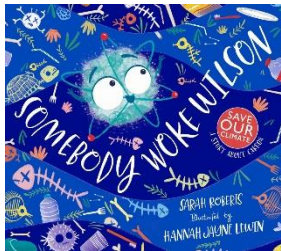

Please Help Planet Earth: A Ladybird eco book

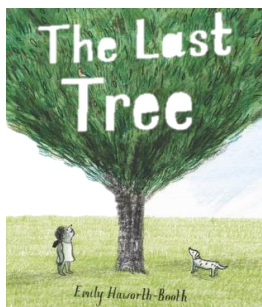

Somebody Woke Wilson: a story about carbon: Sarah Roberts

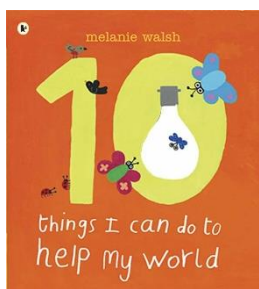

The Last Tree: Emily Haworth-Booth

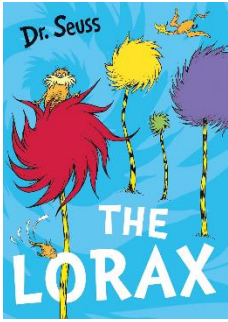

Eco-fable about a gruff but lovable creature determined to speak up for the trees and rally against the mindless progress and the corporate greed that threaten them.

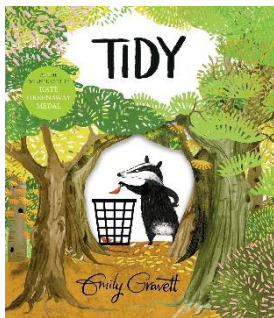

A illustrated children's picture book with a powerful message about plastic pollution in the ocean and looking after our environment

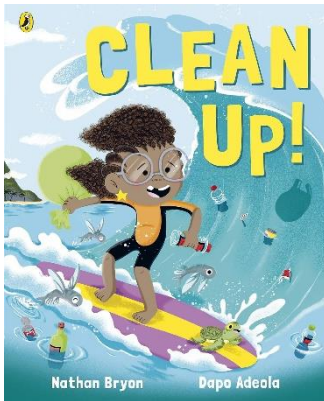

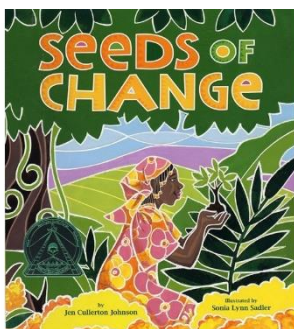


Clean Up! Nathan Bryon

When Rocket goes on holiday to visit her grandparents, she's shocked by the pollution that's spoiling their island home and putting the local sea life at risk.

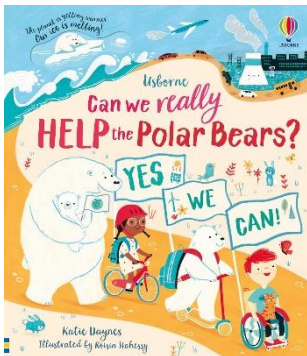
